Welcome

Mr. Alvin I. Bautista Elementary Head Teacher & Community Outreach Coordinator

I was born and raised in Manila, the Philippines, where I studied in the oldest private boys' school, the Colegio de San Juan de Letran, founded in 1621 by the Dominican Province, Order of Preachers. I was an Academic Scholar, a student leader, peer counselor, graduating with the degree of Bachelor of Science, major in Psychology with Latin Honors, Summa Cum Laude, with the Highest Award for Excellence.



I served in the same institution as a faculty member in the Arts and Sciences Department, teaching Basic and Higher Psychology subjects, as well as Physiological Sciences. I was also prevailed upon to serve as Guidance Counselor for the entire collegiate department, eventually becoming the Chairman, National Capital Region, of the College Guidance Committee, Catholic Educational Association of the Philippines (CEAP).



With my wife, Jocelyn Sarreal, from the province of Cavite, we founded the pioneer individualized instruction and values integrated school in the Division of Cavite, offering preschool, grade School and high school (regular and the pioneer adult night high school). As a School Director and Chief Operating Officer, I was responsible for the over-all administration, management of the school, including curriculum planning, human resources development, training and counseling, marketing and promotions, as well as classroom teaching.

Migrating to the United States of America, our family settled in Vallejo, California. We brought our only daughter Agnes, who started Middle School in the county, eventually graduating as High School Salutatorian, and gaining admission to the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) as a full scholar. Agnes has won recognition for her art work and creative writing, winning the First Prize, and Honorable Mention in the Asia Pacific Fund's prestigious Art and Essay Competitions, the only local "Vallejoan" to accomplish the feat. She has also garnered successive Vallejo Unified School District Earth Day Art first prizes, eventually honored by the District for the distinction. Our two sons,

Jonathan Allen and John Andrew, remained in the Philippines to pursue their respective professional careers and vocation. Allen is a lawyer, former Student Debater and Orator, who as a mere high school freshman, reached the National Oratorical Competitions for the Water District; Andrei is completing his graduate studies at the University of Santo Tomas, and has earned his professional licensure as a teacher, and is a professed Dominican Brother of the Order of Preachers. His ultimate goal is to become an ordained priest of the same congregation.



Having loved teaching, the arts and literature, I continued this passion and joined Starting Gate School in Vallejo, a private K-12 educational institution. I was engaged as a classroom teacher, and eventually promoted as Head Teacher, until the year 2019, when the school ceased operations. Within those seven years, I was coordinator for the teacher resource center and library, developed curriculum and training programs, and crafted innovative enrichment programs beyond the regular academic offerings. Among the students I have mentored, a fifth grader, from a family of immigrants notched an outstanding first prize win in the Asia Pacific

Fund Essay competitions. Another middle schooler garnered the Second Prize for his art work for Vallejo's Earth Day last year. Several have received scholarships and recognition for their community participation and outreach endeavors.



I also set up a Chess education program, dubbed as Team Wesley, in honor of Grand Master Wesley So, the US Open National Champion, and just recently the newly crowned World Champion of FISHCER Random Chess, resoundingly defeating the formidable No. 1, Magnus. Wesley So has graciously acknowledged our support and we were privileged to receive his profuse thanks.



The opportunities presented that I have been fortunate enough to avail has deepened my passion for the arts, for writing and for literature. My poetry, Viandante, has been selected by the World Poetry Movement and published in its commemorative collection book. I have also been featured in the online magazines American Chronicle, World Sentinel and Riverside Chronicle for several nonfiction features and historical articles. One article, is prominently featured in the McCune Collection website, a biographical piece on its progenitor, Dr. Donovan McCune. Within the

same JFK Library, Solano Library in Vallejo, my art work, a tribute to my comic book heroes, the Avengers, is now featured in the Teen Section of the Library.

I continue to accept the challenge of renewing myself, nurtured by a lifelong interest in reading, drawing, poetry and the game of kings, chess. I have shared this passion with many talented boys and girls, encouraging them to read novels, fiction and nonfiction, study world history, play chess, express themselves in poetry and creative writing, drawing, composing and vlogging. At the same time, I still enjoy theatre, cinema and binge watch science fiction, drama, documentaries and anime, even the Broadway musicals on HBO, Netflix, Vudu and You Tube. I am an unabashed comic book fan, both of the Marvel and DC Universe, Avengers and Justice League alike, and enjoy sharing my passion with children Pokemon adventures, Miyazaki masterpieces and Japanese anime.



The greatest reward is receiving personal accolades, or even the widest smile, from having my art work to color and collect, or insights learned in my classrooms. Thanks to Facebook, I have touched base with many former students, their families from all over the world, a great number have become educators, professionals and parents themselves. Their tributes are as endearing and heartwarming

for a teacher like myself as they acknowledged my having inspired them, and as such I feel humbled, am truly thankful and enriched.

Picking up on what my favorite author, illustrator and major life influence Antoine de St. Exupery, from *The Little Prince*, about one's own rose, Sidney Jourard shared this gem I carry in my heart, "The fragrance of the rose always stays in the hand that gave the rose." I have given such roses, in the form of the wisdom I have been blessed to impart as teacher, mentor, coach, and to this day, I bask in the fragrance, in the uplifting spirit of a life well lived, priceless and unequalled. I still wish to give out roses, and like the Little Prince and his fox, be responsible for what you have tamed, in a manner of speaking.



In this new challenge working for a dynamic and committed leader, Josie Gerber, and a creative team at the Napa Valley Montessori Learning Center in American Canyon, sharing learning experiences with a vibrant batch of students, as well as with committed, supportive families, I look forward to fun, adventure and high spirits, a whole new world of learning, discovered and powers unleashed.
